

STUDIES IN MEMORY IN POLAND AND ABOUT POLAND

THE 2ND POLISH CONFERENCE ON MEMORY STUDIES

The organizers of “The 2nd Polish Conference on Memory Studies. Studies on memory in Poland and about Poland” would like to invite nominations for the **best monograph on the subject of memory published in 2018**.

Memory studies are interdisciplinary by nature, hence the nominated books can come from any academic field (e.g. anthropology, ethnology, cultural studies, sociology, literary studies, psychology, history, media studies, law, etc.) and describe any problems and issues pertaining to memory studies (e.g. cultural memory, social memory, biographical memory, the politics of memory, studies on trauma, commemorative practices, memory and international justice, etc.).

Requirements:

1. The nominations can be sent by anyone (including the author of the monograph).
2. The book must be an original monograph (it may have more than one author but it cannot be an edited book).
3. The book must have been published in 2018 by any publishing house in Poland or abroad; the language of the publication should be either Polish or English.
4. The nominated monograph must be focused on chosen aspects of memory studies and it must have been written by a researcher affiliated with a Polish university or it must pertain to memory studies in Poland if it was written by a researcher affiliated with a foreign university.

The winning entry will become the basis for the open discussion during “The 2nd Polish Conference on Memory Studies. Studies on memory in Poland and about Poland”, which will take place on December 5-7 2019 in Warsaw. The author of the chosen monograph will have his conference fee waived and will receive a grant to participate in the conference.
